1. Introduction:

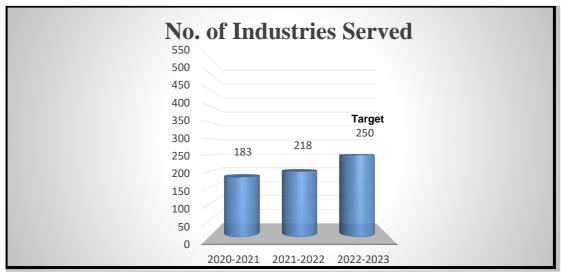


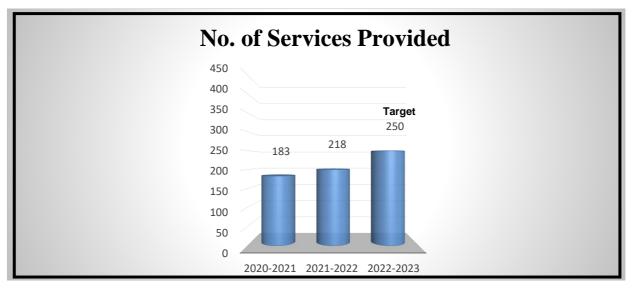








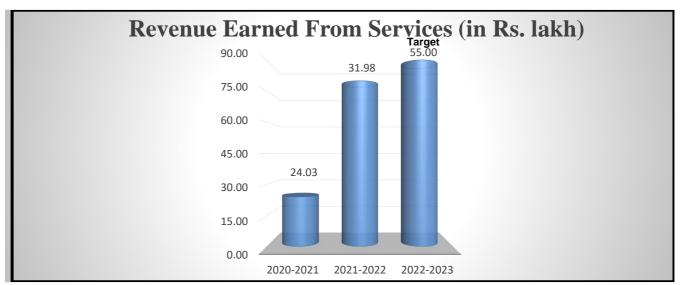

Hence the revised estimated cost in the MoM arrived at Rs 40 Lakhs. So this cost escalation is due to market dynamics/fluctuations. In this context the escalated cost needs approval from competent authority for CNC MILLING MACHINE.

In reference to new price breakup given by L1 vendor it is mentioned that the cost of TWO STAGE AIR COMPRESSOR (2 Nos) is Rs 1 Lakh only, which is as per the Approved estimated cost as per Action Plan 2020-21. However it is to note that total value of the package remains same.
